

ANAPHYLAXIS MANAGEMENT



RLSS UK has partnered with the Anaphylaxis Campaign - the only UK-wide charity solely focused on supporting people at risk of severe allergic reactions. This IQL Level 2 Award in Basic Life Support and Management of Anaphylaxis covers providing First Aid to an unresponsive casualty and recognising a casualty with anaphylaxis. The Anaphylaxis Management course is endorsed by CIMSPA.

WHO IS THIS COURSE FOR?

The Anaphylaxis Management course is recommended for everyone.

Candidates must be a minimum of 16-years-old, at the time of taking the assessment. No prior first aid knowledge is required.

WHAT DOES IT INVOLVE?

The Anaphylaxis Management course is four hours and can be delivered in one day.

The course content includes;

- · Assessing an incident
- · Managing an unresponsive casualty
 - CPR including AED
 - Pocket mask
 - · Recovery position
- · Recognising a casualty with anaphylaxis
- · Using an adrenaline auto-injector

The course comprises practical work and theoretical classroom work, as well as a practical assessment on CPR and the management of Anaphylaxis.

NEXT STEPS...

Upon qualifying, the Anaphylaxis Management certificate is valid for two years. To renew, candidates must re-sit the course again.

The next step is to complete other first aid courses including, Emergency First Aid at Work (EFAW), First Aid at Work (FAW), Emergency Paediatric First Aid (EPFA), Paediatric First Aid (PFA) or Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Programme.
