SCRIPTURE READING

Galatians 5:1, 13-25

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.

For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another. Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and selfcontrol. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.

This is the word of God for the people of God. **Thanks be to God.**



WESTWOOD KIDS

Kids can sit with their families or our Children's Ministry staff for the first part of the Sanctuary Gathering. After the Time with Children, they'll depart the sanctuary together.

9:50-10:30am - Westwood Kids Music

All ages from preschool through 5th grade will share in music ensembles. This time will include a Children's Choir for K-5th grade, Orff instrument ensemble for 4th-5th grade, and musical play for our younger ones. Additionally, our youngest kids will have time to play together.

All ages from preschool through 5th grade get to learn the stories of our faith, and engage in fun, accessible faith-formation activities, in a loving community. TODAY IN THE LOFT

Sunday, June 19th (10:30am) Upstairs in The Loft

Join Rev. Dr. Christopher Carter for "Queer Theology in Post-Roe America." The overturning of Roe v. Wade will have devastating consequences for millions of people in America. The loss of constitutionally protected bodily autonomy will have lasting implications for marginalized persons - women, people of color, the disabled, and queer persons. You may be wondering "what does this have to do with Christianity or Christian theology?" The approach the conservative justices used to interpret the constitution and make their arguments has its roots in the fundamentalist interpretation of the bible. How and why did the traditionalist approach (a relatively new approach) to reading the bible emerge and how are we to push back against it? Join us this Sunday as we explore how queer theology can help us learn how to read the bible in ways that draw us closer to the God revealed through the biblical witness.


Where Do We Go From Here, UMC? Tuesday, June 28th (7-8pm) via Zoom


Fifty-four years after it was officially formed, our United Methodist Church faces real challenges. Dramatic shifts in our cultural landscape have altered the place of our mainline Protestant church in our communities. Long-simmering theological tensions, frequently visible in disagreements about the acceptance and inclusion of LGBTQ+ members, gave rise to a brokered protocol that would allow conservatives to leave to form a new denomination. Then, the Covid pandemic further disrupted all of our lives, and prevented the UMC's General Conference from meeting. Now postponed to 2024, questions about our denominational life remain. Despite the anti-gay policies that remain in our UMC Discipline, more and more of us continue to move forward with the work of full inclusion, including not only Westwood UMC, but our Western Jurisdiction as a whole. Conservatives, previously organized as an Association, on May 1 formally named themselves a separate denomination. So, as people committed to our grace-filled way of living the gospel, where do we go from here? Join Pastor Molly for a series of conversations about the UMC.

Episode 005: "We Must Do the Work of Decolonizing Our Denomination" Rev. Lloyd Nyarota

Lloyd Nyarota is a United Methodist elder in the Zimbabwe East Conference and a GBGM missionary spouse. Lloyd is on an ecumenical appointment in the United Church of Canada, where he serves a shared ministry at St John's United Anglican Church in the province of Alberta; his wife Tazvi is serving ethnic minority congregations in Canada. He has served as a consultant for the United Methodist Board of Church and Society. Nyarota is a founding member of the Central Conference Outreach team, who wrote and promote the Christmas Covenant legislation on regionalization that was submitted to General Conference.
