



When they call to me, I will answer them; I will be with them in trouble, I will rescue them and honor them. With long life I will satisfy them, and show them my salvation.




SCRIPTURE READING Mark 10:35-45 Molly Vetter

GUEST MUSICIAN: THOMPSON HOWELL Sunday, Oct. 17th (9:30am) The Sanctuary

A native of Boston, Massachusetts, Thompson began piano lessons in third grade and quickly advanced. He began studying organ - first with Richard Griffin at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Dedham,



Massachusetts, where Thompson sang in the choir, and then with Brian Jones, former Organist & Director of Music at Trinity Church in Boston's Copley Square. Since moving to Los Angeles in 2006, Thompson has served as Organist & Choir Director of St. Mary of The Angels Anglican Church in Los Feliz and Assistant Organist at St. Thomas The Apostle, Hollywood. He also assisted and substituted regularly at St. John's Episcopal Cathedral. Seeking to find a good balance between his work in front of a microphone and on the organ bench, Thompson has found a nice niche as an in-demand Assistant and Substitute Organist at many churches in the Los Angeles area including Hollywood United Methodist Church, Church of Our Saviour in San Gabriel, Calvary Presbyterian Church in South Pasadena, and St. James' Episcopal Church in Los Angeles.

Violinist Liana Branscome presents an afternoon of the great works for solo violin. She will play Partita No. 2 in D minor by J.S. Bach, which includes his iconic Chaconne, the centerpiece of his solo violin writing, followed by the passionate Sonata No. 4 in E minor by Eugene Ysaÿe, written as an homage to Bach. Also on the program are virtuosic works by Fritz Kreisler and Jessie Montgomery. She will be joined by pianist William Chiang for W. A. Mozart's Sonata in E minor for Piano and Violin, which, like Bach's Chaconne, is a journey of grief and acceptance after the death of Mozart's mother.
