NC Businesses V Clean Energy

There are more than 700 business-owned renewable energy projects in North Carolina, joining a fast-growing trend among businesses, big and small nationwide. Of the 700, nearly 100 solar energy projects are powering retailers' stores and operations. Local retailers across the Tar Heel State are also taking major steps to become more energy efficient, including more than 720 Energy Star-certified retail shops and 75 that have achieved LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification.


According to the Retail Industry Leaders Association, there are more than 657,000 retail buildings across the United States – or 13.5% of U.S. commercial building space – and retailers spend over \$21 billion per year on energy purchases. On average, lighting accounts for 35% of retailers' energy use and HVAC systems account for 47%. Energy efficiency upgrades and generating their own cost-effective renewable energy power present a distinct opportunity for retailers of all sizes in North Carolina.

- Installed solar panels on 25 of its NC stores totaling 10.81 megawatts
- 42 stores have achieved Energy Star certification

Food Lion


- Food Lion has been an Energy Star partner since 2000 and is a leader among NC's retailers in making major energy efficiency upgrades and investments to benefit customers
